A FAITH CHECK

Then he left Galilee and went to the region of Tyre and Sidon, and tried to keep it a secret that he was there, but couldn't. For as usual the news of his arrival spread fast.

Right away a woman came to him whose little girl was possessed by a demon. She had heard about Jesus and now she came and fell at his feet, and pled with him to release her child from the demon's control. (But she was Syrophoenician – a "despised Gentile!")

Jesus told her, "First, I should help my own family – the Jews. It isn't right to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs."

She replied, "That's true, sir, but even the puppies under the table are given some scraps from the children's plates."

"Good!" he said, "you ;have answered well – so well that I have healed your little girl. Go home, for the demon has left her!"

And when she arrived home, her little girl was lying quietly in bed, and the demon was gone.

Mark 7: 24-30 "The Way" Tyndale

In great need, desperation is etched on the non-Jewish woman's face as she humiliates herself at the feet of a Jew! Observe her as Jesus tests her sincerity and rewards her faith.

Jesus must minister to the Jews first. They were made ready by the prophets to understand his message.

But the woman's lack of this preparation is more than made up by her depth of faith. The girl's cure can't be psychological: it occurs at a distance without her knowing how or why.

Hebrew 11.1 defines faith: "What is faith? It is the confident assurance that what we hope for is going to happen. It is the evidence of things we cannot yet see" But more than a definition, faith is a lived experience.

Jesus' authority was something quite new to the Jews. When the Rabbis taught they supported every statement with quotations "There Is a saying that....." When the prophets spoke they said 'Thus saith the Lord"

Theirs was a delegated authority.

When Jesus spoke, he said "I say to you" He did not rely on a delegated authority. He was authority incarnate. Here was a man who spoke as someone who knew. To place our faith in him is to have assurance in the one who can be trusted.
