The Uniting Church Assembly has been working on a whole Church Project named Act 2 giving possible Direction and Options for the Church to consider. All Congregations are invited to read the Report and respond to what has been learnt.

At our Congregation meeting held last Sunday, 17th September Lea Samuels offered to provide further information for reading and discussion by Congregation member.

Copies of the Summary Report are now available for members to take and read. Page 14 of the Full Report says

"Communities of faith identified seven key areas that were hard, frustrating or hindering ministry and mission:

- Ageing and declining community of faith.
- Administration and compliance work.
- Decline in volunteer capacity and skills.
- Convoluted, time consuming wider church processes.
- Tired and burnt out leaders and volunteers.
- Effort and cost in maintaining buildings.
- Decline in finances"

Other than the last point doesn't this sounds like our situation?

Take a look at the report (preferably the full report found at Acts2+Report+Final+Full,pdf") and consider some of the options proposed for change.

Many of these are administrative changes that just might release us for activities closer to our joyous mission to serve! Five copies of the final report have been printed for ease of reading and for circulation.

Praise and Prayer Points. Scientists slowing down time to see more

For most of us the passing of time prompts hardly more than an occasional comment. For scientists however the speed of time has long represented a barrier to understanding important chemical processes. They are excited by the possibility to study smaller and smaller slivers of time and unlock astonishing information about life and changes occurring faster than a blink using new powerful computer systems, called quantum computing.

A recent newspaper article* reported on Sydney University research into chemical processes occurring in a femtosecond, or one quadrillionth of a second. The language only gets more technical but it emerges that our scientists have made a practical breakthrough in slowing down chemical interactions so that matter previously invisible can become visible and therefore able to be understood. Scientists using the new technology can see new molecular structures, for example, those common in reactions involving light. Seeing these new structures is accelerating learning about how the human body and our world works – whether it be about the breakdown of smog, the process of photosynthesis or protection of our DNA.

Man is slowly uncovering long standing and wondrous mysteries of our world. God is the light of our world and as we try to live according to God's standards, we too bring light to the world pointing others to his greatness.
