To everything there is a season

We all experience the seasons of life or the changes that occur in their own time, whether we enjoy them or not. We love some of the changes and we can dread other changes. For example, we love the season of laughing or times of joy, but on the other hand, we do not enjoy the seasons of weeping. Yet, God has something to teach us in all seasons of life we must face.

This church has faced some seasons of weeping in the past. It has also experienced some joy together as we observed the Lord at work in our midst. You and your family have experienced the changes that make you rejoice and the changes that bring you sorrow. The important thing to remember is God is with us to bring good from all that we experience.
