Just before Christmas 2023, two major local infrastructure events were highlighted in the media. One was the opening of the Rozelle Interchange and the other was the almost simultaneous breakthrough of two tunnelling machines into the cavern, which will become the Five Dock Metro West station. No matter what we think about these two events, they represent achievements of human kind.

How are these two events linked other than by 4.6km of parallel tunnels? One of the boring machines is called Beatrice, to honour Beatrice Bush, who many may remember as the woman who for many years, sold newspapers from a traffic island, in the middle of Victoria Road, to drivers stopped at traffic lights. She did this morning and afternoon, rain, hail or shine while dodging lanes of vehicles.

The evening papers the *Sun* and the *Mirror* no longer exist and the distribution of the morning papers has been greatly reduced as many readers now get their morning news electronically.

The *Bible* offers timeless wisdom and guidance about change. Change is deeply rooted in transformation, growth and most importantly, aligning ourselves with God's divine plan. Verses of scripture about change offer stability and hope and remind us that while our circumstances may shift, God's love and promises are steadfast and unchanging.

We are encouraged to see change not as something to fear, but as an opportunity to grow closer to God and to become more like the person he designed us to be.

An example can be found in *Ecclesiastes 3:1 - There is a time for everything and a season for every activity under the heavens.* This verse gives acknowledgement to the seasons of life. It is a reminder that every moment, and every change, has a purpose.
