Praise and Prayer Points. Learning more about God's love, grace and power

In their hearts humans plan their course, but the Lord establishes their steps Prov. 16: 9 (NIV)

Rev Pualilo recently led us through 2 Corinthians 12 which recounts Paul's experience of a thorn in his flesh and his ultimate understanding that the thorn served to both curb his pride and intensify his efforts to focus on his relationship with the Lord.

Do we consider the challenges in our modern lives as different to those of Paul? We might experience more subtle challenges more often, such as plans delayed or halted and have been taught that God responds to our prayer requests with yes, no or wait.

Maybe we just don't register these challenges in our minds as linked to God's plans for us. Perhaps it is only in situations where, like Paul in 2 Corinthians 12, we feel so threatened that we respond and act as bravely as our prayers direct.

Some of us have then been fortunate enough to be lifted out of scary and disheartening conditions into joyful rewarding places not previously imaginable.

These outcomes obviously strengthen our faith in God and in turn encourage us to serve as witnesses to God's love, grace and power.

While none of us know how our lives will progress, we have every reason to choose to live as closely with God as we can.
